You will be camping for the weekend as part of a Patrol, which will be assigned by the course chair. You will attend training sessions geared toward leading your Scouts in the outdoors. You will be sent information on how to contact the other members of your patrol to coordinate gear/tents you may need. You will need to bring your own personal camping gear and toiletries (see the attached lists.) Your Patrol will need to bring equipment for cooking and you should bring your own mess kit to eat with. There is no electricity in the campsites and the facilities are campsite latrines.

Food will be supplied and you will prepare it in your campsite with the other leaders assigned to your patrol. (Please note any special dietary needs on the registration form.)

GEAR

Learners should bring the following:

- Tent – Two can share a tent if they wish (make your own arrangements)
- Sleeping bag – pad, pillow
- Clothing – Class A uniform is appropriate at all times. It may be cold and rainy, be prepared.
The weather at camp is usually 10 degrees colder than anywhere else in the area.
- Personal gear. Toothbrush, towel, soap, etc.
- Cup for drinking
- Silverware: knife, fork, spoon and dishes.
- A Webelos Handbook or Boy Scout Handbook
- A Webelos Leader Guide or Scoutmasters Handbook
- Field Guide or books for plant and animal ID
- A compass suitable for orienteering/map reading
(Silva Polaris type 7, Suunto Partner or Brunton 9020G recommended)
- Materials for campfires such as skits, musical instruments, etc.
- Be prepared for a 1-½ hour hike for plant and animal identification
- Folding knife to sharpen
- Toilet paper
- Personal First Aid Kit
- Notebook and pen/pencil
- Material to make a patrol flag
